# Leaf Printing Prep I & II

**Creativity and Imagination:** Leaf printing encourages children to explore different arrangements and patterns, fostering their imagination and creative expression.

**Fine Motor Skills:** The process of gathering leaves, applying paint, and printing requires precise hand movements, strengthening fine motor skills.

**Nature Appreciation:** Collecting and using leaves from nature fosters an appreciation for the natural world and its beauty.

#### **Crumpling - Prep I**

Fine Motor Skill Enhancement: Tearing and crumpling paper strengthen small hand muscles, aiding in pencil grip later in development. Improves Concentration If you think that tearing & crumpling paper into tiny bits is a simple task, let us tell you that it requires a lot of concentration when a child tears & crumples paper.

#### **Sponge Painting - Prep I**

Sponge painting requires children to grasp and manipulate a sponge, applying pressure to transfer paint, which strengthens small muscles in their hands and fingers. Children engage with the texture of the sponge, the feel of the paint, and the visual impact of the created art, stimulating their senses.

#### **Bomb Mock Drill**
